The Villanueva Pavilion of the Royal Botanical Garden of Madrid has since today a new efficient lighting system in which the Red Eléctrica Group collaborated in the installation of new LED technology as part of its actions to extend its sustainability and energy efficiency strategy.

The new lighting system is launched with the inauguration of *La Sal* exhibition, a show that from today until 23 May brings together a wide repertoire of the most recent work of the National Prize of Plastic Arts winner Carmen Laffón, dedicated to the Salinas de Bonanza in Sanlúcar de Barrameda, a municipality located on the left bank of the Guadalquivir River and in front of the Doñana National Park.
